EDUCATION SECTOR

In 2022, BEM Children's Educational Centers worked on four main fronts: seeking greater integration between the parents of our students and the Educational Center, strengthening the sector of education and Christian ethics, qualifying and training our cooperators team and invest in improving the infrastructure of our physical spaces, aiming to bring more safety to children and work teams. We will detail our efforts within these four points throughout this report:

PARENTS AT THE DAYCARE:

During 2022, at the BEM Early Childhood Education Centers, we carried out an activity we named PARENTS AT THE DAYCARE. This activity aimed to enable families to access the daily life our children are inserted in daily. For an even greater interaction, the parents present at our activity had the opportunity to not only see but to carry out some of our proposals with their children.

In our first meeting, we presented the parents with the pedagogical project we would work on with the children in 2022. This project is prepared before we start the school year, and we describe there all the activities we will develop in that period and what objectives we want to achieve with these activities

For many, many years, the CLAVES Project has been present in all of our pedagogical plans. This project aims to help our children to know their bodies and protect them from abuse and violence. “May 18th – Make it Beautiful” is the biggest campaign in Brazil to combat sexual abuse of children and adolescents. During the “Parents at the daycare” activity, parents and children made together the symbol of the campaign that was later used in a walk that made up our combat campaign. We believe that actions like these help to strengthen the bonds between parents and children and between parents and the institution.



PARENTS AT THE DAYCARE:

What differentiates BEM's Children's Educational Center from the majority of other institutions that provide the same services as we do is undoubtedly our confessionality. Having a humanized service, a qualified team, adequate space, and complying with all the other rules of the Ministry of Education is extremely important for us. But our biggest concern has always been and remains to let our children know about Christ and how much He cares for each of them. For this knowledge to become increasingly accessible, during 2022, we made a lot of effort to strengthen our education and Christian ethics sector. Such efforts bore fruit during two very important festivals on the Christian calendar: Easter and Christmas.

In celebrating Easter, we adopted the theme "It was for me, it was for you!" intending to make the children understand that the sacrifice of Jesus was a gift given to each one of us. Through experiences such as biblical storytelling, painting, role-playing, and demonstrating biblical verses, our children had access (in language appropriate to each age group) to the gift given to each of us because of the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Such understandings were put into practice during a Special Easter Service that we held in one of our local churches. In addition to the children, parents and family members participated in the celebration that had Jesus at the center from start to finish.

Months later, the theme adopted for the celebration of Christmas was “The real Christmas present” and as the name itself shows, we intended to combat the consumerist sense linked to the date. At Easter, we ended the Christmas period with a beautiful service, which included a choir and a theater group made up of our students. Once again parents and relatives were present and were also reached with the exposition of the Gospel of Jesus.

TRAINING AND QUALIFICATIONS:

It is not new that BEM has invested heavily in training its employees. All this effort is aimed at building quality and efficient teaching, which results in offering our children full pedagogical and social development.

To make these training moments possible, we pre-set the dates in our annual calendar and offer all the necessary structure so that our professionals can be fully focused on teaching.

In 2022 alone, we offered more than 10 courses in areas such as first aid, Christian ethics, planning and routine creation. We are talking about more than 100 hours of course given to our more than 120 cooperators.



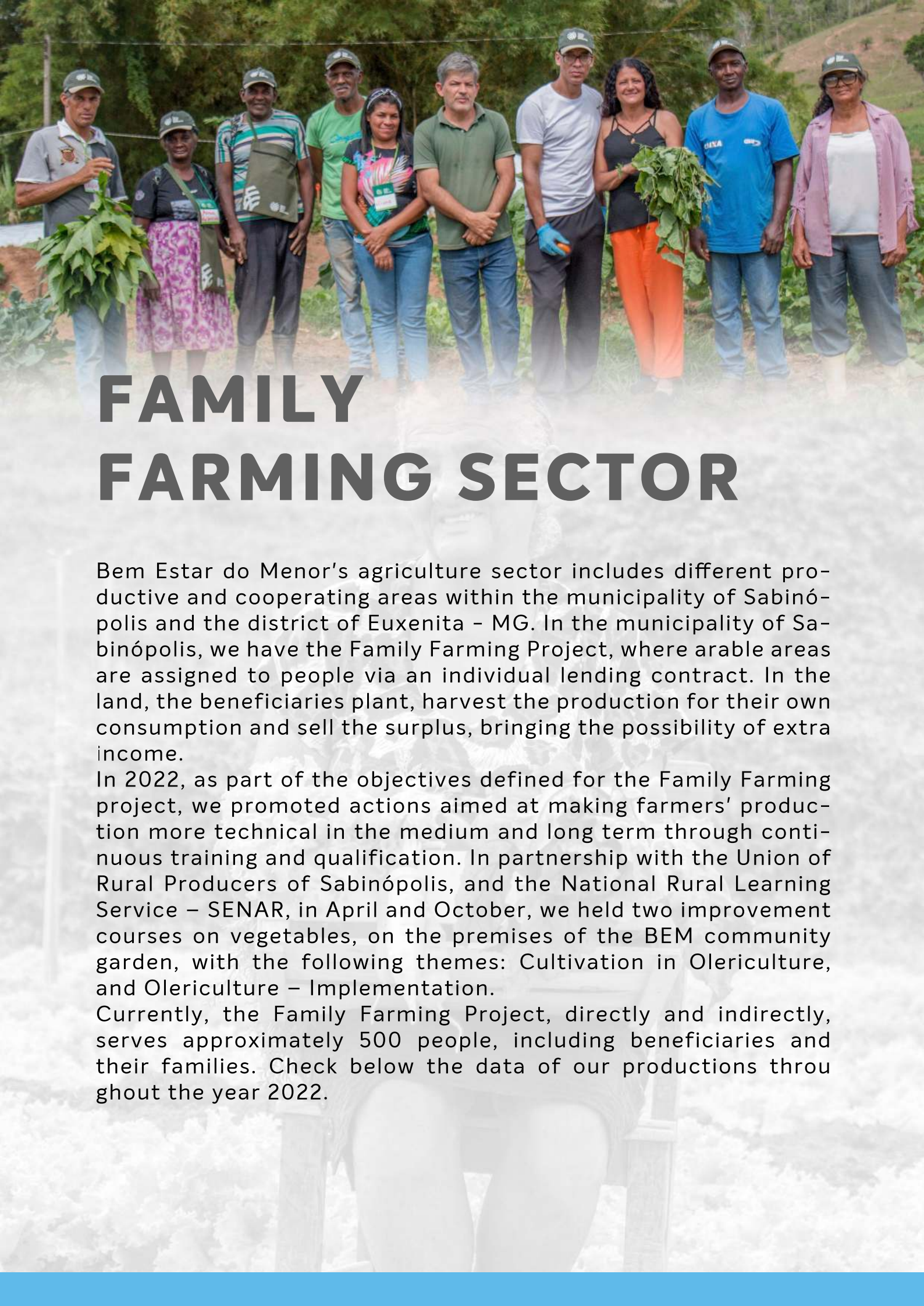
IMPROVEMENTS IN INFRASTRUCTURE:

2022 was also marked by several improvements in our physical spaces. We have made considerable investments to adapt our Educational Centers to the laws in force in our country.

Such investments ranged from renovating walls, expanding the library, installing a solar heating system, installing security cameras, building a toy library, and adapting lighting systems.

The purpose of such modifications is aimed at the pedagogical development and safety of our students and professionals.





FAMILY FARMING SECTOR

Bem Estar do Menor's agriculture sector includes different productive and cooperating areas within the municipality of Sabinópolis and the district of Euxenita - MG. In the municipality of Sabinópolis, we have the Family Farming Project, where arable areas are assigned to people via an individual lending contract. In the land, the beneficiaries plant, harvest the production for their own consumption and sell the surplus, bringing the possibility of extra income.

In 2022, as part of the objectives defined for the Family Farming project, we promoted actions aimed at making farmers' production more technical in the medium and long term through continuous training and qualification. In partnership with the Union of Rural Producers of Sabinópolis, and the National Rural Learning Service - SENAR, in April and October, we held two improvement courses on vegetables, on the premises of the BEM community garden, with the following themes: Cultivation in Olericulture, and Olericulture - Implementation.

Currently, the Family Farming Project, directly and indirectly, serves approximately 500 people, including beneficiaries and their families. Check below the data of our productions throughout the year 2022.

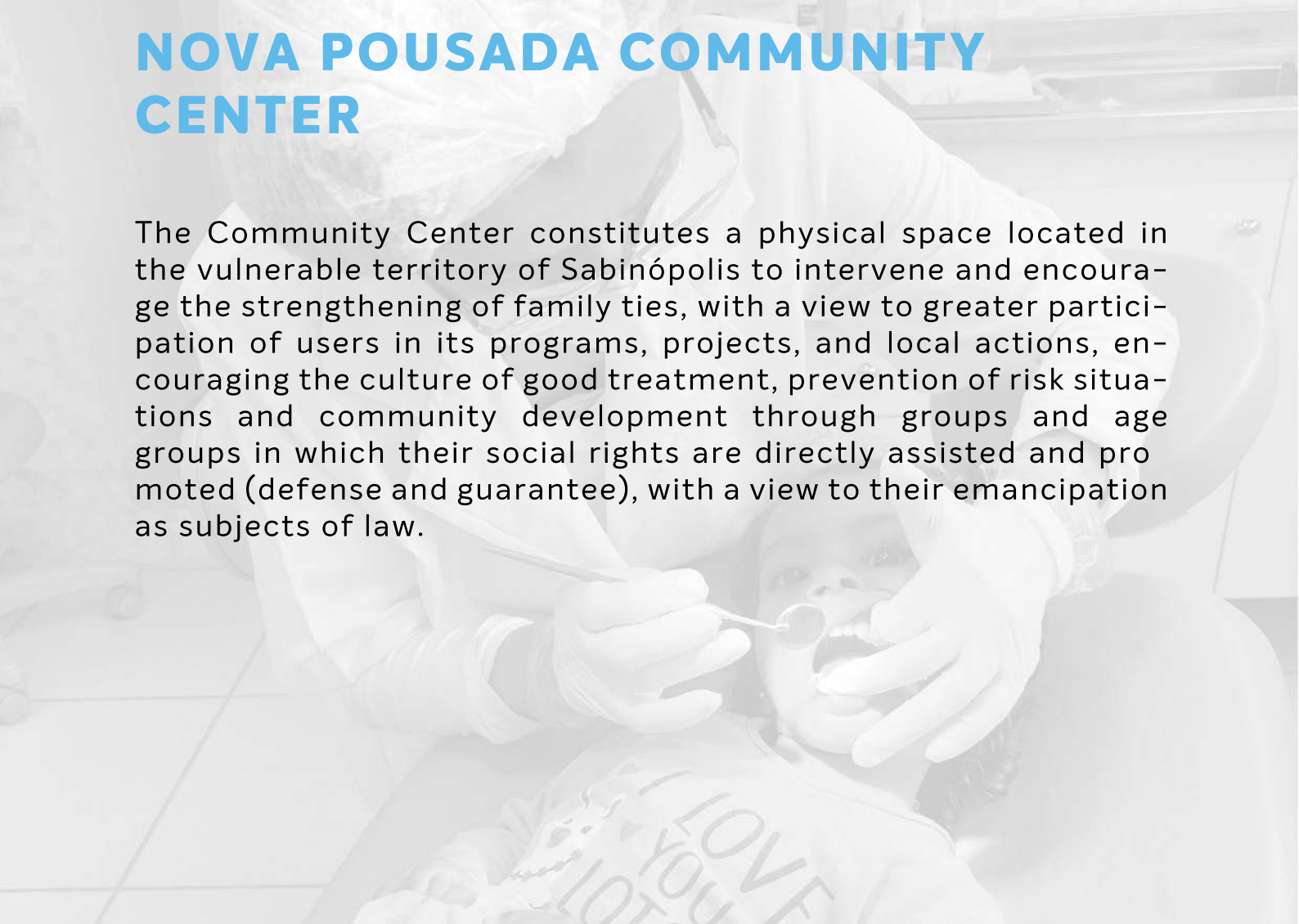




SOCIAL ASSISTANCE SECTOR

NOVA POUSADA COMMUNITY CENTER

The Community Center constitutes a physical space located in the vulnerable territory of Sabinópolis to intervene and encourage the strengthening of family ties, with a view to greater participation of users in its programs, projects, and local actions, encouraging the culture of good treatment, prevention of risk situations and community development through groups and age groups in which their social rights are directly assisted and promoted (defense and guarantee), with a view to their emancipation as subjects of law.



NOVA SEMENTE COMMUNITY CENTER

The Nova Semente Community Center is located at Cristal Avenue, nº. 99; Operário Neighborhood. The project develops community development activities and strengthens the bonds of children and their families with the community of the Boa Vista neighborhood and adjacent areas, sharpening the children's sense of belonging to their territory. In 2022, we continued the project funded via the Term of Development/Collaboration with the Municipal Secretary of Social Assistance and a partnership with the Evangelical Missionary Pentecostal Church – IEMP Boa Vista, for the assignment of physical space.

ALMAS COMMUNITY CENTER

The Almas Community Center is located in the São Miguel e Almas community, on the outskirts of Guanhões.

The various actions we promote in the community are financed by “Equipping Families” which specifically deals with the right that children and adolescents have to family and community life and its consequent relationship with the educational context, aiming at an integrated and close work with families. Through Equipping Families, the Almas Community Center sought to serve children, adolescents, families, and communities, providing support for the physical, psychological, cognitive, and spiritual development of this public, in the sense of strengthening family ties, through reception and care strategies basic, considering the abundant life that we find in Christ, “full development” of their family nucleus and the new parental arrangements.

RIO VERMELHO COMMUNITY CENTER

Among the activities of the Rio Vermelho Community Center is the “Let’s go” Project. This project operates in several areas, such as sports, visual arts, dance, music, theater, information technology, tutoring, and human rights. In addition, it works on the issue of territory, community, and participation, from the perspective of a culture of peace and community coexistence, occupying public spaces, and interacting with everyone, in a relationship of learning and mutual knowledge. The project aims to value teenagers – developing activities that meet the needs of the public and youth, developing activities of protagonism, support, and social guidance. This project received incentives from the Municipal Fund for Children and Adolescents, which provided a semi-professional course in the office package for this age group.
