3 – HISTORY

“But whoever has the world's goods and sees his brother in need and close your heart, how can the love of God remain in him?”. I John 3:17



In 1966, he arrived in Brazil, coming from Stads kanaal, the Netherlands, the Dutch couple missionaries Nicolaas van Eijk and Trijnie. After spending a year working in an institution in São José do Rio Pardo, São Paulo, the couple moved in 1967 to the small town of Sabinópolis, located in the central-northeastern Minas Gerais.

In 1968 they founded the Missionary Evangelical Pentecostal Church (IEMP), and through contact with the numerous social problems in the community, came the realization that the gospel should be presented through the loving care to the needy. The couple begins to serve children and families in their own residence. The biblical message of I John 3: 17 challenges the couple and their Dutch brothers to act on the community's social situation, it was large number of unstructured poor and the malnourished children who wandered begging in the city streets.

Thus, in 1973, it founded the BEM - Well Being of Minors, legal personality body and diaconal arm of IEMP to meet the social needs of children, families and communities. Since then, projects and actions that have been developed over the years have contributed significantly to meeting the needs, the transformation and social development of the communities where the BEM has expanded, as in the mining towns of Sabinópolis, Materlândia, Rio Vermelho, São Paulo, Carmésia, Senhora do Porto e Vera Cruz, in the state of Bahia.

Currently the missionary couple resides in Belo Horizonte and still actively participates as a volunteer in the activities of VEM project. Why have they retire, the couple serves as director of the board BEM. The most significant efforts of the missionaries, however, it is clear the leadership of IEMP church in BH by collaboration and travel arrangements for social work in the cities where BEM is present.

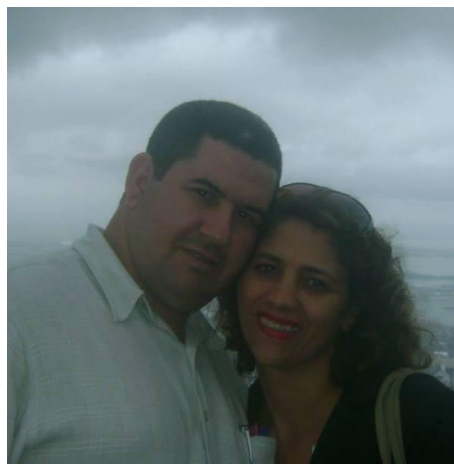

8.1 Child Care Center: *Early Childhood Promotion*



Child Care Centers are educational facilities responsible for the development of children in its multiple aspects: cognitive, affective, social and motor. It can be considered that the Law of Guidelines and Bases of National Education (LDB - Law No. 9.394 / 96) was a major milestone for day care because now belong to the Education System (municipal or state), incorporating

not only the function to care for, but also to educate.

BEM through nurseries, acts for the integral development and social inclusion of children aged 6 months to 4 years old. The development of the child understands the physical, psychological, intellectual, emotional, social and spiritual. The action complements the care and education of the family and the community.

BEM Child Care Centers offer Children and their families rights protection and advocacy. It works cover the period from 7 to 17 hours from Monday to Friday, following the guidelines of the Children's Education National Curriculum Parameters (PCNEI).

BEM Child Care Centers are accredited and its operation is authorized by the State Board of Education (CEE-MG), from 2002, according to the law.

In 2015, it was attended by all, 371 children (188 boys and girls 183) 8 at the units in Sabinópolis Headquarters - 72; Euxenita - 20; Materlândia - 43; Red River - 59; Paulistas - 30; Senhora do Porto - 25; Carmésia - 51, all those in Minas Gerais. Vera Cruz – Mar Grande counted on 71 children in Bahia.

BEM has public resources FUNDEB (MEC) due agreements with local governments, as well as Brazil Affectionate Program (MDS), additional resources for maintenance of day care centers.

BEM believes that children's access to a children's institution quality is a possible and viable way to build a more ethical and just society for all Brazilians.

8.2 Pedagogical Proposal



The **Pedagogical Policy Proposal - PPP** understands the child as a full being and sees education as an ongoing process for development, social transformation generator, economic, political and enabler of the acquisition of autonomy in early childhood.

Above all, BEM believes and teaches the child interdependence of God and the need for a personal relationship through Jesus, the Father's love expression. Playing and interacting are proposed goals for children in the Child Care, in which through sounds, speech, gestures will generating experiences and interrelationships, learning to live in a pleasant way.

In addition to routine activities (bathing, feeding and rest) were carried out various leisure activities, sports, arts aimed at stimulating the development of various skills. Theater activities, excursions, birthday celebration, pool bath, rallies and demonstrations, campaigns, prayer task force, special celebrations and educational interventions.

BEM seeks to meet the local need, which arose in dialogue with families, community and government, aiming to expand the promotion and defense of children's rights in access to education, health, integral development of citizenship and full life.

It involves families, under the perspective that children's lives are helthly connected to their parents'. At the Child Care Center, that has been one of the goals that makes the emotional and protective role of the family is strengthened. Thus, about 420 families participated in various project activities and living events and celebrations throughout 2015. Families also participate in an annual evaluation which

aims to signal weaknesses and strengths of the educational process and consequently the growth and development of children attending at the Child Care Centers.

8.3 Health at the Child Care Center



One of the main child care in early childhood refers to the care of his health. This caution has been done in together with local health systems. In partnership with the local SUS, BEM can monitor the care vaccination, breastfeeding stimulation, growth control and development involving children, families and technical staff (nurses, doctors, health workers, nutritionist, dentist).

So, BEM is attentive to the balanced diet: quality and quantity sufficient for each child according to their needs. The children are monitored and reported to have complications related to the specific weight and health cases that require specialized care. In 2015, 15 were avidly children alert and risk situations in relation to health and nutrition.



9.0 SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

Social protection policy guarantees meeting the basic needs of families and individuals in vulnerable situations. The social assistance rights follow the principles and guidelines of the National Policy and Unified Social Assistance and ITS-Basic and Special Protection Services. The actions are performed in a continuous, ongoing and planned manner, ensuring autonomy and gratuity users.

Development & Empowerment Promotion of Communities

BEM performs free services continued character, permanent and planned with families and individuals in situations of vulnerability and social risk from poverty and exclusion. It promotes the development of communities through counseling, autonomy and users of rights guaranteed in participatory processes.

9.1 Community Centers



The Community Centre project aims the promotion of developed communities in a participatory, integrated, environmentally and socially sustainable with community leaders empowered to work in coordination with the various public and private stakeholders.

It is a space for family strengthening and integration in community development purposes with participation in groups that are fully promoted their rights of citizenship.

9.1.1 Nova Pousada Community Center



Located in the municipality of Sabinópolis-MG, the Nova Pousada Community Centre has developed several activities for family strengthening, protection and defense of rights of children and adolescents, community development and job and income all with the local people involving. About 300 families (1,300 people) were assisted continuously, 120 families in various activities:

- **Community Development** - Meeting with group of residents to discuss and think about actions to improve the community. 4 meetings were held with about 75 people;

- **Cinema Session** - 4 sections of movies to the families;

- **Mothers' Group** (16) – **Teens Mom's Group** (6) socialization, orientation and self-support;

-Men's Group - 15 participants in 10 meetings. All the meetings are monthly in order to offer support, sharing experiences;

-Training & Income: Courses Artisanal Food Production (SENAR-MG) -12 people; Gardener Course (SENAR-MG) 12 people; Hairdresser Course - 9 people; Food and Nutrition: 16 people;

-Rescue's Group: Actions for the community held in four events on Sunday afternoon with the participation of 441 people and 30 volunteers.

- Enjoying - Children group. Total children: from 2 50 to 11 66 encounters performed once a week. Biblical workshops, directed activities guided by relevant themes, workshops in playroom for socialization, strengthening ties and further development of skills are developed.

- Connected - 30 Adolescents 11-17 years 36 meetings on Thursdays from 08h30 to 10h30. These opportunities were made devotionals, sports workshops, workshops and CLAVES IDENTITY workshop working with concepts for self-knowledge and self-worth of adolescents. It was also performed a parade.

- Music Workshop – Guitar / Quoir: Total students: 46 08-17 years. Classes: Flute (first semester): 31 Coral (second semester): 26 Guitar total number of classes: 54 Total presentations: 03.

- Oral Health Attendance to 41 people from the community for two volunteer dentists.

- Research – They were carried out with 60 families in the district, a survey of participation in the activities of the Community Center and other actions aimed at the development of the community.

9.1.2 Rio Vermelho Community Center



Located in Chapadinha district, at Rio Vermelho-MG. It has about 480 families (1,700 people) that were directly met about 200 families.

The action takes place through the partnership with the municipality, through the development of Coexistence Service and Family-SCVF Strengthening connected to the PAIF and the development of social assistance policy. Following the actions taken by the Community Center in Rio Vermelho:

- Family Fellowship - 7 groups with weekly living activities between adults and children to strengthen and family life by promoting good treatment; 30 families, 50 children 0-6 years; 21, 7 to 12 and 32 adult reference.

-BEM Enjoying- Total Children group of children 40 between 7 and 11 years held 70 meetings twice a week. Biblical developed workshops on citizenship activities directed guided by relevant themes, workshops in playroom for socialization, strengthening ties and further development projects and skills. Interaction with families and community through joint action with the service network.

-Mother's Group - 27 mothers / 02 groups, 12 teenagers and 15 adults. Total of 60 meetings; made themes and activities; Devotional, women's health with a nurse Cristiane, psicological follow-up with Dr. Camila, Campaign May 18, Dynamics of Feelings, Lecture with Gynecologist, conversation wheel, Picnic, Marriage, I'm important, family limits, Sport, Good deal Family, Sewing of recyclable toys, Family Planning, Lectures, Preventive Investigations Director, visits to families.

-Conectados: 40 Adolescents 11-17 years, with 35 meetings held on Thursdays attended Drug-prevention campaign, themed Devotional (That's how it all started, not be like a dinosaur, GPS professions, Joseph's life, Christmas, campaign May 18, talk wheel with NASF team once a month, Sexuality (Cristiane nurse) technology, how to use it, fraternization with the Coexistence Group CRAS.

9.2 Family Farming



The Project promotes social and environmental development through organic food production and income generation, targeting the family livelihood and improve the community's quality of life.

All the areas are assigned to families by lending contract to produce food in fields and gardens aimed at improving food not only for the family, but also for the entire community, through marketing, have access to quality food.

The project also contributes to the generation of income through the sale of surplus production at an affordable price.

The planting areas are distributed on the Sites Bethel, Berea and Bethlehem in Sabinópolis, and Beersheba in Euxenita district - Sabinópolis.

In Sabinópolis, 113 families are met and plant in the fields and gardens project. Of these, 31 families have gardens and 82 families plant gardens.

The harvest in the gardens of 10,743 kg of pulses and 48,294 feet sauces and vegetables was held. In the same year, there were 26 meetings and 110 technical support visits to groups.

Among the results achieved are the following improvements:

- Self-esteem by valuing their work and rural culture;
- Income per capita of the family;

10.0 Children & Adolescents Advocacy & Fellowship

Children and adolescents are the priority public of BEM. The mission is to welcome children and provide opportunities, listen, meet their needs and support families to protection and emotional care.

10.1 Bem-Te-Vi



It offers space of coexistence and socialization for children to develop their potential protagonist and autonomy to family life and community.

Bem-te-vi Project met 316 children from 4 to 7 (229) 7 to 10 years (87). These children were living in the municipalities of Sabinópolis / Euxenita (74), Red River (54), Materlândia (66), Paulistas (14), Carmarthen (76) Lady of Porto (14) Mar Grande (18).

Children are welcomed at a different turn when they are at school and are considered age, social and psychological characteristics, development respecting the integration needs, family and community.

The project promotes the prevention, protection and advocacy when in social risk. It provides the play, playful experience and artistic experience. Besides participating in the nutritional development program daily receiving full meals.

Activities and educational workshops were developed (Portuguese and mathematics), school support, sports and leisure, ethics and citizenship, meetings, environment, art and culture, prevention and health, Christian ethics, sexuality education.

In the year 2015, children participating in the project were monthly assemblies for planning and evaluation of the project. These opportunities are aimed at the development of citizenship and leadership. They also had "Acampadentro" expected event for all the children who sleep in the project overnight. There were several actions with parents and families to coexistence and strengthening emotional bonds.

10.2 Connected



Connected is an action that aims to enhance children and adolescents to develop activities that meet the needs of this audience. It happens in partnership with Living Services and Strengthening Linkages - scFv of the municipality of Sabinópolis.

They participated in the service 53 children and adolescents. In all, 25 children participating in this project and 28 adolescents.

Workshops were held, promoting access to library, computer, theater, dances, tours and meetings of groups of friends, and the development environment and healthy relationships.

The role of BEM Social educator is to apply ethical and Christian principles in systematic workshops with children and adolescents so that you can make healthy choices for different areas of their lives. Another important activity is the availability for conversations listening and dialogue on relevant topics or individual needs of children and the adolescents.

10.3 CLAVES – Playing we Strength Ourselves to Face Hard Situations

Proposal prevention of abuse and sexual violence in childhood and adolescence, as well as the promotion of good treatment family. Through systematic workshops, the claves provides a playful and participatory approach promotes the reduction of vulnerability of children and adolescents through the development of personal, family and community strengthening factors.

Songs, dances, board games, theater games, stories, puppets, riddles, puzzles and other techniques are explored in the workshops.

In 2015, the workshop were given to 285 children, and 169 children aged 4 to 6 years old; 104 children aged 7 to 11 years, and 12 adolescents. The 17 groups of children and adolescents participated in 9 sequential workshops with 18 teachers trained in CLAVES methodology.

The CLAVES Brazil taught by BEM 3 courses "Play in strengthened to Face Difficult Situations" in Pequeri - MG (RHEMER); Sabinópolis-MG (BEM) and Palhoça - SC (CADI) with a total of 81 educators, and leaders trained to use the methodology with children and adolescents in their communities and projects. 10.4 Orange House

It provides temporary shelter in residence, providing childcare tailored protective until it is made possible return to the family of origin. It is a Social Protection Service Special linked to the ITS - Unique System of Social Assistance - Municipal Department of Social Services.

The **Orange House** has capacity to serve 10 children from 0 to 12 years residents of the Rio Vermelho municipality. Over 2015 were met 16 children and adolescents. They left the house after court decision, 8 children referred to family reintegration of origin or extended, temporary custody or adoption. In December, remained in host 8 children and adolescents with a family approach the stock awaiting the judiciary referrals.

Children and adolescents are maintained daily and sent to education, health and social welfare of the municipality. systematic hearings by the judiciary are carried along with the network protection of children and adolescents. These opportunities, discussions of cases and decisions concerning the progress and each child processes are performed.

The social approach is made by the technical team to families for improvement of ties, parenting skills and possible resumption of the care of the children and finally return of children to family care.

The team at Orange House consists of 9 caregivers a coordinator, a social worker and a psychologist.

11.0 FAMILY ACTION

Mistreatment Prevention & Protection



It aims to strengthen the family as a protective and preventive function, providing space and support to improve the quality of life and access to guidance and assisting partners' rights.

Families referenced in all projects BEM, about 998 receives social workers team assistance through home visits, interviews, counseling, referrals and participating in systematic family gatherings and events like the "Parents in the project" and "Family Feast "meetings with families, mothers groups, family life. There were 362 actions in family groups during 2015 in 13 projects of BEM projects.

11.1 VEM – Widows Fellowship Center



Promotes the socialization of women only through sociocultural activities, contributing to improving the quality of life in the spiritual, social and cultural areas. Contributes to the strengthening of life with God and with others and confirms that a circle of friends and support is formed.

Happen systematic activities with monthly meetings (10) every 3rd Tuesday of the month from 14:30 - 16:30. biannual meetings 10h00 - 17h00 with reflections, games, lectures on issues related to their lives, annual camps, bimonthly newsletter sent to each participant, home visits and the Community Center with meetings twice a week (about 72 annual meetings).

Psychological support - lectures on topics of interest to single women and the specific problems they face, "group therapy" are still performed; Evangelism and spiritual edification - through home visits, lectures, devotionals, support, friendship and guidance, practical and emotional support to newly widowed, mutual aid.

The transport of all the participants happen through two project Kombis. Volunteers contribute through their skills with project activities.

About 65 women participated in the activities of the Social Centers located in Belo Horizonte and Sabinópolis - MG. The physical spaces used are donated by Missionary Evangelical Pentecostal Church in Belo Horizonte and the BEM-Sabinópolis.

It is observed that the VEM project contributes to one of the Millennium Goals of UN. In 2015 were achieved the promotion of women. Being a project focused on elderly women needs, it contributes to the appreciation of the elderly woman and improving their quality of life improvement, besides contribute to women widowed, divorced, separated and single, they are encouraged to take charge of their lives and become the protagonists of their stories.

12.0 RIGHTS PROMOTION & ADVOCACY

They consist of actions aimed at promoting and defending social assistance rights and active citizenship through participation in public policy councils, community groups, campaigns, events, meetings and networks. Those constitute advocacy actions developed by BEM.

BEM operates in favor of strengthening and promoting advocacy of its participants through training, advice and facilitation of leadership, and community development to strengthen the organization, autonomy and leadership.

12.1 Children and Adolescents Protection and Prevention Policy



A Protection for Children and Adolescents Policy - PPCA was built collectively by the social agents involved in the BEM project. The document aims to generate an institutional strategy based on internationally established standards to provide security and protection to children and adolescents participating in social projects developed by BEM.

By implementing the PPCA, BEM wants children and adolescents to become protected in accordance with standard practices that keep them away from danger and their rights preserved.

12.2 Public Policy Municipal Counseling

About 58 BEM actors participated as municipal councilors in 45 councils and joint committees of public policies in seven municipalities where BEM operates in the states of Minas Gerais and Bahia.

These holdings contributed to the social control and the development of social policies, the supervision and quality of services and citizen participation that allows the fulfillment of local needs and demands.

Of these shares, there were other actions such as mobilizing and strengthening networks through specific thematic discussions, training, new projects and approach with various levels of government, legislative, executive and judiciary, greater awareness and organization by the citizen's rights and combating basic violations.

A team of social workers BEM participated in 178 meetings Councils (forums, meetings, conferences) in the municipalities of Sabinópolis, Materlândia, Rio Vermelho, Paulistas, Senhora do Porto, Carmésia and Vera Cruz: Welfare Rights of the Child and teenager, School Feeding, Health, Milk's life; Development Sustainable Rural, Elderly, Collegiate School.

12.3 Partnerships

Mãos Dadas Network

It consists of 26 national and international partners that aim to strengthen actions for promoting dignified life to children and adolescents in social vulnerability situation that have guaranteed their rights and exercise their citizenship in an integral manner. The RMD produces the Holding Hands Journal for disclosure of their actions and support those who work for the dignity of children and adolescents participate in the Holding Hands Annual Meeting Network in Rio de Janeiro in March 2015. There were 3 campaigns through the Holding Hands network given in 2015: Prayer Taskforce; Social Educator Day and Church friend of Children. 20th Holding Hands Prayer Taskforce (June 5th to 7th) - Annual International mobilization of prayer and intercession for the children and teenagers at risk with the theme: "Jesus present in every child's childhood." They participated in the task force in 2015, about 808 children and adolescents and 85 adults in 11 projects BEM.

Social Educator Campaign (17th September) – The mobilization reached 95 BEM social workers. Social agents of partner projects and tutelary councilors of municipalities participated. It was up to local churches IEMP, that conducted the campaign.

Brazil Bible Society (SBB) in 2015, distributed significant publications of quality for families, children and adolescents. All the support material for social educators and community facilitators in the development of Christian values and preventing situations of domestic and community violence. All material has excellent quality and invaluable in sharing biblical values. Writing literature contributes to the educational and cultural development of the citizens of the communities and social support, emotional and spiritual families, children and youth had access to the material.

18th May Campaign - Sexual Abuse Prevention in Children and Adolescents. Every year on this date, BEM participants and educators go in marches with the protection networks in Rio Vermelho counties, Sabinópolis, Materlândia, Carmarthen.

Municipal Conference on the Rights of Children and Adolescents - Sabinópolis – MG - 29th April, 2015 - presentation of suggestions and proposals from the free conference with children and adolescents that occurred in 2014. Facilitation of the working groups.

Pre-Social Work Conference – Nova Pousda Community - Sabinópolis – 25th June - Social justice, participation, Federative Pact, ITS Program.

Municipal Plan for Sanitation - FUNASA - Sabinópolis. It occurred in September and had the participation of two technicians in the preparation of the Plan.

12.4 Interfaces with Public Policies



In each municipality, the projects have developed a productive dialogue and joint actions in particular the Departments of Health, Social and Educational Assistance.

Higher incidence of programs was in health: school health, preventive action against obesity and malnutrition, dental health, nutrition, weight and development control, domestic accident, defense and rights of children and adolescents, medical services of paediatrics, pro-youth, joint peace, family farming.

Through FUNDEB and National School Feeding Programme (PNAE), BEM got resources for Child Care Center.

There were also contacts with the judiciary in the municipalities of Sabinópolis, Rio Vermelho and Carmésia to receive funds from cash benefit.

12.5 Educational Measures & Community Work

Were referred by the court to BEM (Rio Vermelho, Materlândia, Paulistas and Sabinópolis), seven adult alternative sentence of compliance. Attended services, outdoor area cleaning design and construction (3 men and 4 women) for periods 8-30 hours per week.

Educational Measures - Community Service Provision (PSC) - Three teenagers (3 male and 1 female) were met, forwarded by the judicial or special protection service of the municipality. Participated aid in general service activities with adult supervision.

13.0 HEALTH

Health, Food and Nutrition Security



Adequate food is a fundamental human right. The Food and Nutrition Security is the right to regular and permanent access to quality food in sufficient quantity, for the promotion of health and that are environmentally, culturally, economically and socially sustainable.

BEM promotes organic food production that are served about 700 families of Child Care Centers, Bem-te-vi with providing meals that contribute to the growth, development and formation of healthy eating and nutritional habits. To do so, use standards and guidelines of PNAE - National School Feeding Programme and the guidance of nutritionists.

Were served in 2015, about 429,262 meals (complete and snacking) in various projects BEM for about 1,019 children, adolescents, adults and seniors, representing about 17,175 meals a day.

With the implementation of a dental office in Nova Pousada Community Center in Sabinópolis, about 60 people were treated in 47 visits to December 2015, and as a priority public, the women of the community, since these do not have much access to care for public network.



14.0 ADDITIONAL ACTIONS

In addition to direct assistance to project beneficiaries, BEM carries out activities aimed at strengthening and improvement of their work teams.

There is an offer of alternative spaces for the projects, beneficiaries and community, and involvement and participation of volunteers.

14.1 Bereia Conference Center - BCC



Support site for sporting events and leisure, training, socialization, camps, conferences, BEM groups meetings. The space is also open to churches, municipalities, projects, schools. Serves both Sabinópolis public as the region. The BCC received in 2015, a total of 4,353 people in 47 events with the participation of young people (958), children (717) and adults (2678).

Among the activities developed in the BCC, are weddings, sporting and leisure events, birthday celebration, graduation, camps, trainings, conferences, baptisms of churches and hosting.

14.2 Volunteers

BEM actions to capture and manage volunteers who offer their time, skill and solidarity in various community services.

We have many volunteer fronts. We highlight the presence and voluntary contributions from families participating in the project.

In 2015 they served as volunteers 131 people in activities such as craft workshops, music, recreation and sport, agricultural technicians, driver, general services, psychologists and physiotherapists, counselors, speakers, services and programs to families.
